
This data pack provides a profile of the **Moree** CLSD region using data from the following sources:

It also includes the Foundation's Need for Legal Assistance Services (**NLAS**) indicators. A complete list of indicators with detailed definitions is included on slide 9.




#### Population count by postcode


#### First Nations population count by postcode




### Total Fines Issued – Postcode 2400


### **Overdue Fines – Postcode 2400**
