If you have objected and are dissatisfied with the delegate's decision following objection, you may apply to the NSW Civil and Administrative Tribunal ("NCAT") for an administrative review of the decision to issue the order. You may also apply to NCAT if 90 days have passed since objecting and the delegate has not determined the objection. The 90 day period does not include periods in which the delegate is waiting for you to provide further information once requested.
