


# Population count by postcode





# Overdue Fines – Postcode 2840 (Bourke)



# Overdue Fines (18-24 Year olds) – Postcode 2840



# Overdue Fines – Postcode 2839 (Brewarrina)



# Overdue Fines – Postcode 2827 (Gilgandra)
