








First Nations population count by postcode





NLAS(Capability) count by postcode



Total Fines Issued – Postcode 2430










Overdue Fines – Postcode 2430







Overdue Fines – Postcode 2422



Overdue Fines (18-24 Year olds) – Postcode 2430








Overdue Fines (18-24 Year olds) – Postcode 2428


