**Travel Entitlements** 

**Travel allowances** 

> a practitioner located within 35kms of the court; > a practitioner who is significantly closer to the court;

approved where the matter could be assigned to:

- > Unless there are exceptional circumstances, the travel allowance will not be approved in circumstances where a practitioner appointed to a panel has nominated their availability for a panel court out outside the geographical
- If travel allowance is being claimed, approval should be sought in the original application. Travel allowance cannot be claimed more than once per day to the same court, regardless of the number of legal aid applicants being represented at that court.

> Pursuant to the Duty Solicitor Scheme Guidelines travel is not generally paid to practitioners rostered to attend court as the Duty Solicitor except where there has been prior approval by Legal Aid NSW or the duty work is undertaken in one of the regions nominated in the Duty Solicitor Scheme

Where approved, travel will be paid at a rate of \$0.68 per kilometre, or where appropriate, a return economy airfare (whichever is cheaper).

Payment for travel will only paid where the private lawyer is travelling over 35

### kilometres (one way). The hourly fee rate is paid at \$85. Note: Travel allowances will be paid at actual kilometre rates submitted
