

Legal Aid NSW Private Lawyer Panels

To complete and submit the online panel application form go to the <u>Panels</u> Application Website and use your Grants Online username and password to log in.

Only a nominated Principal of a law practice or barrister can submit this panel application form.

Before commencing the panel application form ensure that ALL legal practitioners who will be undertaking legally aided matters are registered for Grants Online.

In order for your law practice to be appointed to this Panel, you must have at least one legal practitioner employed at your law practice who meets the <u>individual panel requirements</u> to undertake work for this Panel.

g) For each legal practitioner listed, attach a referee report from a suitable referee confirming the listed practitioner has 5 years post admission experience in the Care and Protection jurisdiction. This is a mandatory requirement for eligibility to undertake work covered by this Panel.

Legal Aid NSW will not follow up the referee reports.

Applicants can provide the <u>link</u> to the referee reports to their nominated referees.

The referee must be independent. They must not be employed by or have a commercial interest in the law practice where the practitioner/s listed are currently employed.

You can attach the referee report/s when submitting your application via Panels Application web site. Alternatively, you can email a copy to panels@legalaid.nsw.gov.au.

Legal practitioners at your law practice who do not meet the individual panel requirements **CANNOT** be listed to undertake work covered by the Panel.

However, ineligible legal practitioners may be delegated work covered by this panel involving the representation of ADULT clients only. They MUST be supervised by a legal practitioner at your law practice who is eligible to undertake work from the Care and Protection Panel.

18. Does your law practice nominate to be appointed to the Independent Children's Lawyer (ICL) Panel?

Barristers cannot be appointed to this panel.

In order for your law practice to be appointed to this Panel, you must have at least one legal practitioner employed at your law practice who meets the <u>individual panel requirements</u> to undertake work for this Panel.
