

## Appellate Criminal Law Barrister Panel

New applicants seeking appointment to the panel must:

- Meet the individual eligibility requirements;
- Complete the application form; and
- Attach two completed <u>referee reports</u>, one from Senior Counsel and one from a member of the Bar Association.

Legal Aid NSW will not follow up the referee reports.

Applicants can provide the link to the referee reports to their nominated referees.

Applications submitted by applicants who do not meet the eligibility requirements and/or without the two reports from the prescribed referees will not be approved and the applicant will have to reapply.

To complete and submit the online panel application form go to the <u>Panels</u> <u>Application Website</u> and use your Grants Online username and password to log in.

#### **SELECTION CRITERIA FOR NEW APPLICANTS**

- 1. What was your date of admission as a legal practitioner?
- 2. What was your date of admission as a barrister?
- 3. Do you have a current practising certificate?

(Applicants are not required to provide a copy of their current practising certificate)

### 4. Are there any non-standard conditions or undertakings on your practising certificate?

#### 5. If yes, please provide concise submissions that address:

- i. What are the non-standard conditions or undertakings on your practicing certificate;
- ii. When were they imposed and for how long;
- iii. Why were they imposed; and

iv. How LANSW can be confident that you meet the <u>Quality Standards</u>.

### 6. Have you been denied appointment to any Legal Aid NSW panel within the last six (6) months?

- 7. If yes, please provide concise submissions that address:
  - i. What reason did Legal Aid NSW provide as to why you were denied appointment?
  - Legal Aid NSW will only consider your application if there has been a material change to the circumstances in your response at (i). Please outline the material change in circumstances relevant to your application.
- 8. Have you practised in criminal law as a solicitor?
- 9. If yes, i) for how many years and ii) were you a Law Society Accredited Specialist in Criminal Law?
- 10. Approximately what percentage of your practice over the last 12 months has been criminal law?
- 11. Provide an outline of your experience in the practice of criminal law including three examples of matters involving complex issues of law and procedure in which you were the appellate/advocate counsel.

When describing each matter, summarise:

- i. the charges on the indictment;
- ii. the Crown case;
- iii. the defence case;
- iv. the significant legal, procedural and evidentiary issues in the case.

#### 12. Provide an example of your written work in one of the following:

- a) Merit advice (as Junior Counsel if necessary); or
- b) submission on appeal from a higher court (as Junior Counsel if necessary); or
- c) submission on a complex sentence matter.

You can attach the examples of your written work when submitting your application via the Panels Applications web site.

13. Provide an example that demonstrates how you applied your knowledge and understanding of the operation of the Court of Criminal Appeal, in particular Supreme Court Practice Note CCA 1.

- 14. Indicate that you are aware of the <u>Legal Aid NSW Quality Standards</u> and will comply with those standards.
- 15. Indicate your capacity to comply with Legal Aid NSW reporting and administrative requirements including compliance with the <u>Terms</u> and <u>Conditions of Use of Grants Online</u>.
- 16. Provide examples that show you have the ability to address legal issues and briefly describe how you would communicate with a client where the following issues arise;
  - a) mental illness
  - b) Cognitive and / or physical disabilities
  - c) domestic violence;
  - d) who are socially or economically disadvantaged;
  - e) from wide ranging culturally diverse backgrounds.

Address each issue separately. Give examples that show that you have the ability to address legal issues and briefly describe how you would communicate with a client where these issues arise. In addition give examples that show that you have the ability to identify these issues and briefly describe how you would represent a client where these issues arise.

Are you named as a defendant in a final apprehended domestic violence or apprehended personal violence order (or other state equivalent)?

- v. Provide concise submissions that address how, despite this disclosure, LANSW can be confident that your law practice, and the listed legal practitioner/s employed at your law practice, meet the Quality Standards
