☐ Serve your spouse If you don't serve your sour application may be adjourned or dismissed.	 By hand, or By post. You don't need to serve your spouse if you file a joint application. There are special rules you must follow to serve your spouse in prison. You must serve your spouse at least 28 days before the court hearing, if they are in Australia. If your spouse is overseas, you
	must serve them at least 42 days before the court hearing.
□ Prepare and file an Affi of Service	If you served your spouse by hand, you must file: • An Affidavit of Service by Hand (Divorce) • Acknowledgment of Service (Divorce) • Affidavit Proving Signature (Divorce), if your spouse signed the Acknowledgement of Service (Divorce).

If you served your spouse by post, you must file: • An Affidavit of Service by Post (Divorce) completed by you • Acknowledgment of Service (Divorce) signed by your spouse. Apply for substituted or If you are unable to serve your spouse, you must make an Application for Substituted dispensation of service orders Service Orders or Dispensation of Service Orders. You can apply for: • Substituted service – if you can still contact your spouse, for example via Facebook or email • Dispensation of service – if you can't contact your spouse and do not know where they are. To do this you must file an: Application in a Case, and Affidavit.
