#### **PLEADINGS AND PARTICULARS**

- The plaintiff and the defendant were in a relationship from 1 February 20XX until 15 July 20XX.
- In May 2021, the plaintiff went to the Queensland for a three-month work contract.
- During this time, the plaintiff and the defendant had an understanding that the plaintiff's pet dog, Charlie, would be cared by the defendant.
- 4 While the plaintiff was in Queensland, the plaintiff and defendant ended their relationship.
- The plaintiff returned to NSW in August and asked to get her goods back, including her pet dog Charlie and a Dell laptop.
- The defendant had given the Dell laptop as a birthday gift to the plaintiff during their relationship. The market value of the Dell laptop is \$250.
- 7 The plaintiff had purchased the dog, Charlie from a local breeder for \$750.
- The plaintiff sent a letter of demand to the defendant on 10 August 20XX to recover the pet dog, Charlie and the Dell laptop.
- 9 The defendant refused to return the goods upon demand.
- 10 The plaintiff claims:
  - a. An order for the recovery of the goods, or;

b. In the alternative, an order for \$1,151.000 for the value of the goods.

- If money is claimed, and you believe you owe part of the money claimed, by:

- Paying the plaintiff that part of the money that is claimed.
- Filing a defence in relation to the part that you do not believe is owed.
