- At all material times the plaintiff was the driver and owner of a black Mazda 3, NSW registration number ABC 123.
- 2 At all material times the defendant was the driver of a red Toyota Yaris, NSW registration number DEF 456.
- On 1 December 20XX, the plaintiff was reversing his car out of a parking space at the shopping centre on Burwood Road, in Burwood NSW, 2124.
- Before the plaintiff reversed his car, the plaintiff checked his rear and side mirrors, and the car park lane was clear.
- As the plaintiff was slowly reversing his vehicle, the defendant's car suddenly entered the lane and collided with the plaintiff's car.
- 6 The collision was caused by the defendant's negligence, for the following reasons:
 - a. The defendant drove too fast in the circumstances;
 - b. The defendant failed to keep a proper lookout;
 - c. The defendant didn't stop or control his car to avoid the collision;
 - d. The defendant failed to safely control his car;
 - e. The defendant didn't sound his car horn or provide any warning that he was approaching.

- 7 As a result of the defendant's negligence, the plaintiff's car was damaged.
- 8 The costs of repairing this damage are as follows:
 - a. Repair to back bumper \$350.00;
 - b. Repair to back left side boot lid \$350.00.
- 9 The plaintiff has paid a total sum of \$700.00 to repair the damage caused by the defendant's negligence.
- By letter dated 5 February 20XX, the plaintiff demanded payment of \$700.00 from the defendant.
- The defendant has failed to pay this amount to the plaintiff. The defendant did not respond to the plaintiff letter at all.
- The plaintiff claims \$700.00.
