




Inmate Request for Information

You can use this form to ask for a copy of your overdue fines or to have your overdue fines placed on hold

Note:

- Print clearly using BLOCK LETTERS in the space provided and tick the appropriate boxes
- If all sections are not completed, your application cannot be processed
- Providing a false or deliberately misleading statement may lead to a prosecution under Section 307A of the Crimes Act 1900
- Driving restrictions, or any other actions taken against you by Revenue NSW may remain in force until all
 outstanding fines and additional costs have been paid, or a payment plan has been arranged

- The person you nominate. Note: disclosure of your name only in this instance
